## The Hudson Valley Bullshit Society

HVBS Official Minutes of the 3<sup>rd</sup> 2011 Meeting on April 27 at the Hoffman House in Kingston, NY.

- 1- PC Wiz's Camry arrived with Shadow at 11:14 AM. A few minutes later the immaculate Acura of Geronimo appeared.
